It was started in the year 1988 mainly to work for the street children, working children and for marginalized youth who were in need of care and protection and for their wellbeing through proper rehabilitation. After having worked about twelve years with the marginalized people at the grass roots level on 27th September 2000 it was registered as an independent social service society under Tamil Nadu Society Registration Act 1975. At present it has recognized by the District Administration and by other non-profitable organization as one of the leading child rights organizations in Salem district.

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES:

“Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world”

Anbu Illam Children have their daily educational activities such as morning reading and writing practice, Education in the school and Dropout center, evening reading and writing practice and evening study. These environments make them pursue education for their life. This year the Staff motivated the children to study well from the beginning itself. The children were given orientation in the school as well as in the Home. All the marks and improvements had been noted and followed. Children have written NTSC Exam, which helps them to know more about Government Exams. We have celebrated the most important national and international days, that help them to improve their knowledge about the society and the world.

This year we have given the opportunity to Our Boys to attend the digital literacy course. They began the Computer Literacy course in September and completed it successfully in October. This course equips students with knowledge about computers, mobile, emails, and Google.



HEALTH INTERVENTION

Everyday morning the boys are asked to do the exercise. Boys have attended medical camps to check their health. These camps are very much useful for them to get treatment. After the medical camp medicines, ointment and syrup are provided according to their need. Boy's health cared very well. Boys have been taken to hospital immediately by staff as soon they feel sick. All the health records are being followed. Health awareness classes have been conducted for the boys. Monthly once given Nilavembu Kasayam. General cleaning of their own goods had been followed. At present all the boys have taken the second dose of vaccination to prevent them from the deadly virus.

CHILDREN'S GROUP

Children's parliament plays a key role in the development of management ability and leadership qualities of Children. Once in a month, the children are having the children's parliament meeting. The children's parliament and the children's group have empowered themselves a lot this year. All the ministers have made awareness and fieldwork in the Home. We have taken some innovative initiatives to assess the growth and participation of the Children's parliaments this year. It was very useful for the boys. Apart from the Children's parliament, they did so many works and activities by these groups. Boys have their regular meetings on Children parliament, Children's group, food committee and Children's meetings. They too have HMC meeting for once in three months.

TALENT AND CAPACITY BUILDING

The institution has facilitated boys with very many Seminars and activities during the year. Every month the staff and coordinators animate the boys with the theme which improve their capacity. We conduct a talent building activities and games in a week based on their exams and studies. This year we have called the resource persons to take motivational classes, De-addiction classes. They have Brain Gym and yoga classes. And weekly they were animated by the brothers. These help them to build their capacity and talent. To improve the communication Skills of the boys, each boy is asked to give evening talks. Which help them to address the crowd.



COMPETITIONS

We have organized so many competitions that forces them to do their best and helped them to learn more. Apart from that they have attended competitions in Schools. Boys attended online Competition on the day of World Science Day. Boys have attended an online quiz competition conducted by the election commission of India and received E-certificate. In these competitions they well participated and got prizes and Certificates.

ADIVARAM - CHILDREN'S HOME AND OPEN SHELTER

CHILDREN'S HOME

The Children's Home at Adivaram, foothill of Yercaud was started for the children from street by Salesians in 1997. The inaugural program was headed by then District Collector, Hansraj Varma. Later, the service was extended to Children who came out of their homes and desolate children. We

provide them with healthy food, clothing, medication and education. We do provide the children with healthy environment. They are sent to Vinayagampatti government middle school.

184 students are being benefitted from the same for the past one years. 34 students have benefitted and gone out of the institution in the last one years. At present we have only 34 children.

MEDICAL CAMP-08.06.2021

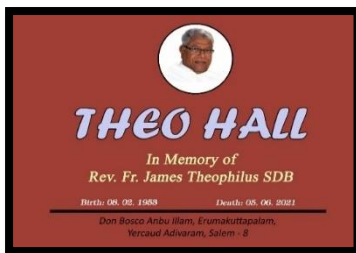

God to use these constructively for our welfare.

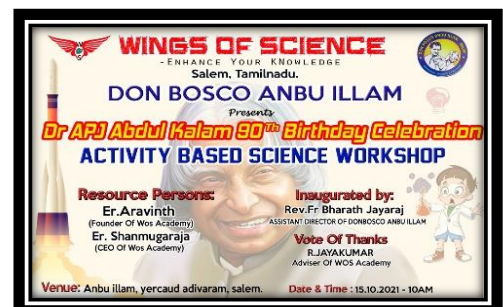

Learning/Visible Positive Effects/ Difficulties faced:

- To identify youngsters and civil society members through this event. It is useful for further works
- Boys prepared themselves and maintained their discipline at daily practice.
- The interest and coordination of boys is very much improved is visible positive effect

RIGHT TO PARTICIPATION IN CULTURAL EVENTS – CELEBRATION OF PONGAL WITH CHILDREN

Indira nagar children belong to marginalized community and often deprived of opportunity in festivals. To ensure the participation of children in cultural events CFS team in collaboration with Indira nagar community members organized **Pongal festival** (Harvesting Festival) to children. The Celebration was held on 13.01.22 at 10.00 am. Ambedkar children club members with the help of the village head Mrs. Selvi cooked pongal with new pot. All the children enthusiastically participated in this Pongal event. Mr. Xavier is a former child welfare committee chairman presided over the function. Salem, Mr. Johnpaul Child Welfare Salem Coordinator. Salem, Mr.kalai, Mr. Karthik Mr. Abhishek were present. Mr. Xavier distributed face masks for the kids. Mr. John Paul gave awareness about corona and importance of children participation in Pongal festival. Following this the children were given Pongal. CFS team organized party games to all the children and distributed snacks and prizes to children.



Learning/Visible Positive Effects/ Difficulties faced:

NO DISCRIMINATION DAY

On 1.3.22 in court road colony CFS in coordination with civil society members organized a awareness event to teach the children the importance of non-discrimination in their community. Children took oath to treat their peers with dignity and respect.



OBSERVATION OF WORLD WATER DAY



World water day was observed in Indira Nagar. Abdul kalam children group organized a capacity building activity for their children group. Children learned about the importance of preserving water through the short film. Demonstration of saving water in daily activity was done to the children. Saving water while taking bath and brushing and using the wastewater for plants growing and garden.

Children led activity – Intervention on Protection

Issue: Safety of children in the evening due to non-functioning of Street lights in Indira nagar.

Process: During the Ambedkar Children Committee the children discussed about the non-functioning of streetlights in their location. Children expressed the fear and thread caused in the evening. The issues have been in presence more than two years. The community members had given petitions several times to city administration, but all was in vain. Children planned to address the issues.

Living healthy and importance of early diagnosis in children. Children along with medical department and community members took oath on eliminating TB and protecting children. 200 drawing by the children were exhibited. 150 children from our 10 children's groups and other part of city participated in the TB awareness drawing activity. Children from age group of 7 to 17 participated. 99 % of the participants are

Participants will be awarded participants' certificate. Ensured SDG 3 Good Health and wellbeing of children and SDG 17 Partnership with health department and community to safeguard children from disease.

STREET CHILDREN RESCUE DRIVE

On 7.1.22 District Child Protection Unit, Childline, Open shelter and CFS team carried out a drive in Salem city to identify and rescue children living in street. The purpose of the drive is to identify the families and children living in streets. Study has been done and have identified 10 families.

CARING GROUP MEETING

Caring Group meeting on 05.3.22 we conducted caring group monthly meeting and discussed about the area and protection of children. Discussed about the issues of school children roaming around us stand. Sensitized members on E- shram registration an id card provided by the central government to unorganized labours. Created awareness on Tuberculosis – symptoms, mode of spread, precaution methods and treatment facility available in health system.

The government of India has introduced scheme E-sharam registration for unorganized workers for providing welfare through this patrol. Government has opened the gateway for self-registration, so everyone allowed for registration for respective unorganized workers. We organized a two-day drive at Nanjampatti to enroll unorganized labour in to the schemes.

On 18 and 20th of December evening we conducted a drive at Nanjampatti. Mr. Ravi, Civil society member and our supporter inaugurated the drive. Parents of our children group members were our major targets and community. First, we explained in details about that scheme and registering process then only we enter into the registration. More than 30 family get benefited through this drive. 17 members are enrolled to scheme. Second Drive was held in Patchapatty. Mr. Karthick supported the community with enrolment. 42 members are enrolled to scheme.

ACTIVITIES IN NEWS PAPER



ADOLESCENT GIRLS GROUP:

In 30 villages we have formed Adolescent Girls Group. The numbers of group formed in villages is 40 groups. The numbers of girls at present in group is 634. In a month second and fourth Saturday is for adolescent girl's group meeting. Awareness was given to the adolescent girls group by holding a group meeting on child marriage, child labour, good touch, bad touch, etc. by setting a "SMS call me priya" model in group meetings. Raise awareness among other classmates by making them fully aware of the problems caused by early marriage of female children and also the physical uterine damage. Adolescent girls group girls raised their marriage age to 23 and said they would be studying for a master's degree and would be able to make their own decisions and choose the right partner for them. Thus, if there is a child marriage in the village, the number 1098 has been informed about the means of preventing marriage.

**ADOLESCENT BOYS GROUP:**

In 30 villages we have formed Adolescent Boys Group. The numbers of group formed in villages is 30 groups. The numbers of girls at present in group is 496. In a month first and third Saturday is for adolescent boy's group meeting. Gave the future guide line for the higher education, Self-discipline. Mental health training was used to diagnose students' mental state and raise awareness about what constitutes stress and the effects of depression. Through this training, Adolescent boys group are free from drugs and misconduct and concentrate on their studies. Adolescent boys groups members give motivation to other students to be examples for others.

**COMMUNITY RESOURCE CENTRE:**

In 30 villages we have Community Resource Centre. We formed 30 Children groups and total numbers of members in the group is 1238. Children became aware of the rights of children and their protection by holding a children parliamentary meetings. As the corona impact was high in 30 villages during the corona period, children were made aware of the need to use community space about corona, disinfectant, face mask, gloves and tincture in the evening class center. At the evening class center children are trained in painting, karate etc. To develop their individual skills according to their wishes.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT GROUP:

In 30 villages we formed Community Support Group. Total numbers of group member are 484. Every month have a CSG committee meeting, they are made aware of their rights and basic needs to obtain them, so that they can go to the panchayat office and petition for the basic facilities required for the village themselves and fulfil their needs. CSG team members along with panchayat leaders are planting saplings with the aim of making the village greener. Singalandapuram, Pusaripalayam, Kurukkapuram, Chinna Kakkaveri In the area, CSG team members along with Panchayat



leaders are planting saplings. CSG team members in 30 villages were sensitized to give corona vaccine to the villagers to protect themselves from corona infection.

WORKERS SUPPORT GROUP IN VILLAGE AND INSIDE MILL:

In 30 villages we have formed Worker's support group 482. Inside of the mills we formed worker support groups for Migrant. 10 mills 200 workers in the group. The people working in the Spinning mill were made aware of the importance of the workers support group, its benefits and how to lead the group. WSG members were also given awareness on scheme of Rs 12 (PMSBY), Rs 330 (PMJJBY) and Atal pension scheme. The WSG team members were also made aware that maternity leave should be given to the first child with twenty-four weeks of paid leave and the second child with 12 weeks of paid leave. Mill workers were also given awareness on 8 hours of work, determination of minimum wage, leisure time and amount of compensation.



SELF HELP GROUP:



In 30 villages we formed 30 Self Help Group for the women and the total numbers of members in 30 groups is 441. A few women group members from 30 villages have become self-employed and improved their livelihoods by providing incentives. SHG members in villages have started small savings schemes within themselves saving up to Rs 200 per month. In this savings, the SHG members are working together to raise Rs. 5,000 to Rs. 10,000 as an interest free revolving fund for their urgent needs such as education, auspicious events and business start-ups.

SEWING MACHINE:

Sewing machine distribution for the differently able peoples. Donors are Pix Rock Vfx Private limited, Chennai. We select the persons with disable from our working villages, who know to stitch. But they don't have sewing machine. At present, they earns an average of Rs. 250 a day by getting a free sewing machine through the Don Bosco Anbu Illam."



SAFEGUARDING TRAINING:



Safeguarding policy training for DBAI organization staff (10.03.2022). Safeguarding policy is one of the important parts of the organization. In this training our staff learned about overview of safeguarding. How to form a policy. What are the main policies are inside the one single safeguarding policy. How to receives a concern and then, what are the processors to act for the concerns. All the 22 participants felt it was very useful, interactive, and grateful to Dr. Thirupurasundari madam and Dr. Kirishnamooty sir for their valuable guidance and supports.

STAFF REVIEW MEETING:

Every month we have a staff review meeting for the 6 filed coordinators and 30 facilitators to check the mints note of the group of CSG, ABG, AGG, WSG, SHG groups in the village. Training for the facilitators about School management committee, Worker support group, SMS call me priya, Internal committee.



HIGHER EDUCATION SUPPORT:

We gave higher education support for “5” students from our working village. Now they are currently pursuing higher education by receiving a scholarship through the Don Bosco Anbu illam”



PRI TRAINING:



The PRI training provided for 23 Panchayat elected leaders. (4 Village Panchayat presidents and 19 ward members) After the training the trained members now they actively presented and work in the panchayat attain the VLCPC meetings. At present through these PRT training it is transformed and the women themselves are working from the responsibility of the Panchayat Head. In addition, the Rural Development Project was prepared in collaboration with the Panchayat Chairman and the ward member. As a result, the underpass was set up to prevent the spread of disease and germs in the village. Also saplings have been placed in the lakes and areas around the village to make the village greener. The panchayat leader meets the villagers directly and talks about their problems.

INTERNAL COMMITTEE:



12-08-2021, 13-08-2021, 22-08-2022 & 03-02-2022.

We newly formed Internal committee in NKCM, siddeswara spinning mill, Sakthi mill, SVM textile, Jeyaraj spinning mill. Total numbers of members in the IC is 60. This committee for the women worker in the mills. If there is any problem for the women workers inside mill like sexual abuse, sexual harassment, gender discrimination. This committee is receiving concerns from the victim and take act for the concerns.

INTERFACE MEETING:

25-02-2022, 28-02-2022, 23-03-2022:

We had conducted three interface meeting in our working villages, there are Koppampatti, Annaipalaiyam, and Muthukkalipatti. In this interface meeting total numbers of participation are 183. In this interface meeting village people together for fulfill the needs of the villagers. This meeting is mainly for the children from the villages, To aware of their rights.



PRE-DEPARTURE TRAINING:

04-12-2021, 11-12-2021, 17-12-2021 & 28-12-2021:

The Pre-Departure orientation training was conducted for the migrant workers of SVM Textile mill, Anitha spinning mill, CR Textiles, NKCM. 200 migrants were participated. To provide training for migrants about the problems they faced before and after migration. In this training migrants came knew about the what are the things should know before they departure for the work.

08.03.2022 the women's' day celebration was held in Anganvaadi at sannyasikundu and vadi. and this celebration was held under the leadership of Mrs. Sumathi. and those who participated in this celebration were given awareness about the continue education centre. as a highlight of this gathering, we spoke about the problems of drop out students when they drop themselves from the school. Around 35 women participated for this program, eventually they were encouraged continue to study.



NUTRITION SUPPORT

Those who come to the drop out centre for their studies were given lunch. Aleast every month minimum 05 to 10 people were helped in their nutrition way for their studies.

RECREATION

For the relaxation and the refreshment of the students of the drop out center we had given some free time for their indoor games during the time of their lunch break and evening time

We had gone to JJP house to get the approval of our works once again. After getting approval from the JJP house we started to give counselling for the children. And we continue to give awareness for them through the mutual learnings of games and stories in the forms of social, justice, and ethical stories.



HIGHER EDUCATION FOR GIRLS

Don Bosco Anbu Illam provided support for educational fees for higher studies of girls children. The girls were affected by various abuses, so we selected for their educational aid programme, it was aided by colourful children foundation Netherlands through this programme 1. Sona studying diploma in Nursing, 2. Pavithra studying B.Sc Nursing, 3. Logeshweri 3rd Year Paramedical, 4. Nandhni studying 3rd year B.com., 5. Vinothini studying 3rd year Nursing. Through the programme the girls overcome the personal issues.
